Private Swim Lessons 30 minutes \$100 and 15 minutes \$70. Adding a \$20 swimming pass for 5 sessions. Pool passes and swim lessons must be paid online or at City Hall.

Date: March 24, 2023 Re: Langworthy Court

You will recall that we postponed this consideration from last meeting as I wanted to confirm that the road was properly located and described in the land the City would take ownership with. I spoke to the Buesing surveyor that completed the original plat and confirmed that the street is properly described. The concern was how the right of way lines on Beacon appear to be off, but it is just the Beacon system being skewed south, it is not platted incorrectly.

The owners, Beck Construction, have completed all the work to prepare for this consideration which includes having a warranty deed prepared, title insurance policy and a release of mortgage on this portion of the land. All of these documents have been reviewed and approved by Attorney Steve Liedinger from Lynch Dallas. If the City Council wants to continue with this decision, the approval of Resolution #23-23 is appropriate.

Back Info Below:

We are reviewing the previous plats to best determine what actions need to be taken to consider the acceptance of the road. City Attorney Steve Leidinger did suggest that the City Council consider maintaining the road completely after acceptance. This is due to the liability of owning the road and having someone else conduct services such as snow plowing.

From the December Meeting:

Back when Langworthy Court was built there was discussion with the City about dedicating the Right of Way to the City as is normally done. The City did give an exception to the normal lot frontage size. In 2013 after discussion and the City not wanting to take ownership, Mike agreed to keep it private at that time. He is requesting that the City Council reconsider this decision and take ownership of the road. He is willing to continue to plow the road until he is not physically able to do this work. I have researched some history and found minutes from 2013. One issue I see is that our ordinance requires that lots be developed when on a public street tor alley. The earlier minutes and the Zoning Code page is included. I am not sure where this leaves the City if this was developed on a private street which cities do not normally allow. We can discuss it at the meeting and get some City Council input and possible direction.

Re: Rezoning Requests Third and Final Readings

The Planning and Zoning Commission met on February 16 and held the public hearing about these two requests. No objections were filed for either action. The Public Hearing before the City Council was held February 27 and no objections were filed. At that meeting the City Council passed the first reading. This agenda item is consideration of the third and final readings.

The first Ordinance is #04-23, which is all of the properties in the Parkridge Phase 1, 2 and 3 subdivision which is being developed by Maryville. When the first two phases were developed there was no rezoning made from Agriculture. This action would make all the existing and final Phase 3 lots R- Single Family Residential.

The second request, Ordinance #03-23, is to go from M-2 Heavy Industrial to C-1 Highway Commercial on two 1st Ave East lots owned by the Cascade Economic Development Corporation. This will continue to move toward the goal to have the 1st Avenue main corridor a commercial area.

WHEREAS, the Cascade Planning & Zoning Commission has approved the rezoning request and recommends to the Cascade City Council and the Cascade City Council concurs with the Planning & Zoning Commissions recommendation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Cascade, Iowa, as follows:

Section I. That the Zoning Code of the City of Cascade, Iowa, is hereby amended by rezoning Parcels 1932126004, LOT 2 CASCADE INDUSTRIAL PARK and 1932126016, LOT 2 CASCADE INDUSTRIAL PARK 6TH ADD; on 1st Avenue East, Cascade, Iowa, from M-2 Heavy Industrial to C-1 Highway Commercial in the City of Cascade

Section II. The City Clerk is hereby directed to make the above change on the Official Zoning Map of the City of Cascade, publish the ordinance in the Cascade Pioneer newspaper and submit the Ordinance to the Dubuque County Recorder.

Section III. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon publication as provided by law.

As you know from the last meeting we now have our new values. Using those new values at the same tax rates as last year we would be losing \$100,000 in revenue. That is approximately \$30,000 due to state law changes and \$70,000 from the shift in TIF funds. The max levy that the City Council approved was \$1,049,275. The amount needed to balance the budget as it has been presented is \$1,004,830. That leaves \$44,445 additional dollars for the Council to add to the operating budget using property taxes. The rate to get to the levy of \$1,004,830 is \$9.52639 compared to \$8.10639 last year.

The presented budget includes the same dollars for street projects, park projects, increases in liability and health insurance, increased and accurate pool costs, cost of living adjustments, the same amounts to outside agencies, an extra \$10,000 for City Hall capital, 15% of Clerk and Admin costs going to TIF, additional Ambulance equipment funds from Jones County, additional legal funds to address downtown properties.

In addition, due to the decrease in the values, the debt rate will have to increase in order to generate the same \$100,000 toward the street debt payment. Last year's debt levy rate was \$0.82397 and in order for it to be \$100,000 in the levy, the new rate would need to be \$0.95.

Bill Hosch also discussed with me the idea of still adding more funds for street or storm repair work. Based on the max levy there would be the additional \$44,445. Another way to add to that amount is that the Council could use the debt levy for the full amount of street debt which is \$140,550 instead of only \$100,000. This would open up \$40,550 to be used from Sales Tax for streets instead of debt. If you added the extra levy capacity and this sales tax it would be a maximum of \$84,995 towards additional project work.

Another decision that needs to be made is which line items you want to use for the new dollars such as: Liability, Property and Self Insurance, FICA and IPERS and Other Employee Benefits.

Lastly, the Council must pass a Resolution indicating when the public hearing will be held. In order to comply with the deadline for publication the hearing would be Monday, April 24 which is the regular Council meeting night. The budget is due to the state April 30.
